


Mexique Coffee Table

Designed by Charlotte Perriand

The Mexique coffee table by Charlotte Perriand was originally conceived in 1952 as a desk for the dorm rooms at the Maison du Mexique at Paris' Cité Internationale Universitaire, the resulting Mexique table was originally fabricated by Les Ateliers Jean Prouvé which led to confusing misattribution of the design over the past several decades. A low version of Mexique- the Mexique coffee table was developed in 1956 and first shown at Galerie Steph Simon, Paris.

The Mexique coffee table features a thick, exquisitely sculpted triangular top with a rounded edge profile that is available in a choice of solid natural American walnut or natural oak – each juxtaposed with canted legs composed of folded steel in a matte black finish. A tall version of Mexique has also available as a table or desk.


Matt Black painted frame
